- □ **Register** for the exam at <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/mda"> "Licensing, Certification & Registration" > "Pesticide Applicators' Certification Examination Schedule". It will point you to <a href="https://www.michigan.gov/pestexam">www.michigan.gov/pestexam</a>.
- $\ \square$  Finish **studying** the documents above, and preparing your pesticide recordkeeping system for the future.
- □ **Fill out** application <u>www.michigan.gov/documents/mda/Pesticide Applicator Cert Reg App 251926 7.pdf,</u> including that you want to take exam parts:
  - o Michigan Commercial Core certified pesticide applicator.
  - o Category 2 Forest Pest Management.
  - o Category 6 Right-of-Way Pest Mgt.
  - o Category 9 Regulatory Pest Management (if you are a government worker).
  - o Category 10 Demonstration & Research.
- □ If you get bored, read <a href="www.michigan.gov/mda">www.michigan.gov/mda</a> > Licensing > Pesticides, application, MI regulation 636 and maybe 637.

## 4 Take the tests

□ Take **\$75** exam as above.

Stand there while they grade it, and get any paperwork they give you.

- ☐ If you pass:
  - Update your resume and LinkedIn.
  - o Update your pesticide **recordkeeping system** that you have this certification.
  - o **Scan** the letter and card, and keep a copy in your pesticide folder.
  - $\circ$  Set up a Recurring Task, for every  ${\bf 3}$   ${\bf years},$  to update your license.
  - o If you intend to **apply pesticides for hire**, you must also acquire a <u>Pesticide Applicator's **Business**</u> License PABL. It also needs to be renewed periodically.
